Artist Description Tivi Paningajak ∩ (1917 – 1991 Indigenous / CAD) Ivujivik, Quebec. One of the participants in the Puvirnituq workshop was named Tivi Paningajak, who later became well known for his many prints alongside other artists like Tivi Etok and Leah Qumaluk. But his artistic skills were not limited to printmaking: he made jewellery—necklaces and rings made from ivory—sculptures and even qulliqs from soapstone and his own hunting gear. His daughter, Mary Paningajak, said that when her father went camping he would come back with pieces ready to be sold at the

co-op. Beyond the pure joy the artists felt for creating, one of the reasons they started to sell prints was to support their family financially, to purchase hunting supplies and to provide food for their children during famine.
